Maine Students Selected for United States Senate Youth Program **--Students Headed to Washington, D. C. and to Receive \$5,000 Scholarship--**

January 11, 2016, Washington, D.C. -- Senators Susan M. Collins and Angus S. King, Jr. today announced the names of the two students who have been selected as delegates to the 54th annual United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP) that will be held March 5 – 12, 2016 in Washington, D.C. Julia Blackwell of Woolwich and Lexie Jamieson of Scarborough were chosen from across the state to be part of the group of 104 student delegates who will attend the program's 54th annual Washington Week.

The USSYP was created by Senate Resolution 324 in 1962 and has been sponsored by the Senate and fully funded by The Hearst Foundations since inception. Originally proposed by Senators Kuchel, Mansfield, Dirksen and Humphrey, the impetus for the program as stated in Senate testimony is "to increase young Americans' understanding of the interrelationships of the three branches of government, learn the caliber and responsibilities of federally elected and appointed officials, and emphasize the vital importance of democratic decision making not only for America but for people around the world."

Each year this extremely competitive merit-based program brings 104 of the most outstanding high school students — two from each state, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity — to Washington, D.C. for an intensive week-long study of the federal government and the people who lead it. The overall mission of the program is to help instill within each class of USSYP student delegates more profound knowledge of the American political process and a lifelong commitment to public service. In addition to the program week, The Hearst Foundations provide each student with a \$5,000 undergraduate college scholarship with encouragement to continue coursework in government, history and public affairs. Transportation and all expenses for Washington Week are also provided by The Hearst Foundations; as stipulated in S.Res.324; no government funds are utilized.

Julia Blackwell attends North Yarmouth Academy and serves as her Senior Class vice president. She is involved with several extracurricular activities, including Key Club, Executive Council, and serves as captain of the math team and basketball team. She is also involved with Girl Scouts, working towards her Gold Award, serving on her local service team, and being the current national delegate for the Maine Girl Scout Council. Julia plans to pursue international relations and gender studies at Colgate University next year. She is passionate about engaging in work that helps to fight human trafficking and supports victims of human trafficking.

Lexie Jamieson is a senior at Scarborough High School, and currently serves as the New England and Bermuda district governor of Key Club International. Her other activities include serving as the treasurer of the Civil Rights Club, a member of the National Honor Society and Seeds of Peace. Lexie plays soccer and lacrosse, and is a member of the wind ensemble band. She will attend Bates College in the fall to study anthropology or women and gender studies. Lexie plans to establish a nonprofit organization that addresses women's rights and healthcare in developing countries.

Chosen as alternates to the 2016 program were Chandler Clothier, a resident of Lewiston, who attends Lewiston High School and Patrick Grady, a resident of Kennebunkport, who attends Kennebunk High School.

The chief educational officer in each state selects the delegates after nomination by teachers and principals. This year's delegates were designated by Mr. William Beardsley, Acting Commissioner.

While in Washington the student delegates attend meetings and briefings with Senators, House Representatives and Congressional staff, the President, a Justice of the Supreme Court, leaders of cabinet agencies, an Ambassador to the United States and senior members of the national media. The students will also tour many of the national monuments and several museums and they will stay at the historic Mayflower Hotel in downtown Washington, D.C.

In addition to exceptional leadership abilities and a strong commitment to volunteer work, the student delegates generally rank academically in the top one percent of their states among high school juniors and seniors. Now more than 5,000 strong, alumni of the program continue to excel and develop impressive qualities that are often directed toward public service. Among the many distinguished alumni are: Senator Susan Collins, the first alumna to be elected U.S. Senator; Senator Cory Gardner, the second alumnus to be elected U.S. Senator and the first to be elected to the U.S. House of Representatives; New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, the first alumnus to be elected governor; former Chief Judge Robert Henry, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit; former Ambassador to West Germany Richard Burt, and former presidential advisors Thomas "Mack" McLarty and Karl Rove. Additional notables include former Lt. Governor of Idaho David Leroy, former president of the Progressive Policy Institute Robert Shapiro, military officers, members of state legislatures, Foreign Service officers, top congressional staff, healthcare providers and university educators.
