# Behavioral Threat Assessment - A Proven Approach to Violence Prevention

#### **Facts**

- Those headed down a path of targeted violence display observable behaviors (i.e. they don't just "snap")
- When school communities know these warning signs, they can intervene and help
- Behavioral Threat Assessment is a fact-based, non-punitive method of identifying the reasons a student may be headed down a path of violence
- BTA uses a collaborative, multidisciplinary team to assess and identify effective interventions and supports that mitigate a potential threat

#### **Outcomes**

The following outcomes are based on the research done by Dewey G. Cornell, Ph.D. and can be accessed here - https://www.schoolta.com/research

- 99% of threats made by students who receive a threat assessment are not carried out
- Schools using BTA, see a decrease in their use of suspension
- No disparities were found among Black, Hispanic, and White students in out-of-school suspensions, school transfers, or legal actions
- Counseling is used more often for students who receive a threat assessment

- Both students and staff report a more positive school climate
- Students report less bullying and more willingness to seek help from adults
- Special education students may be referred for threat assessment at higher rates, but do not receive disproportionate treatment
- When law enforcement is part of a collaborative BTA team, law enforcement actions (arrest, incarceration or court charges) rarely occur
